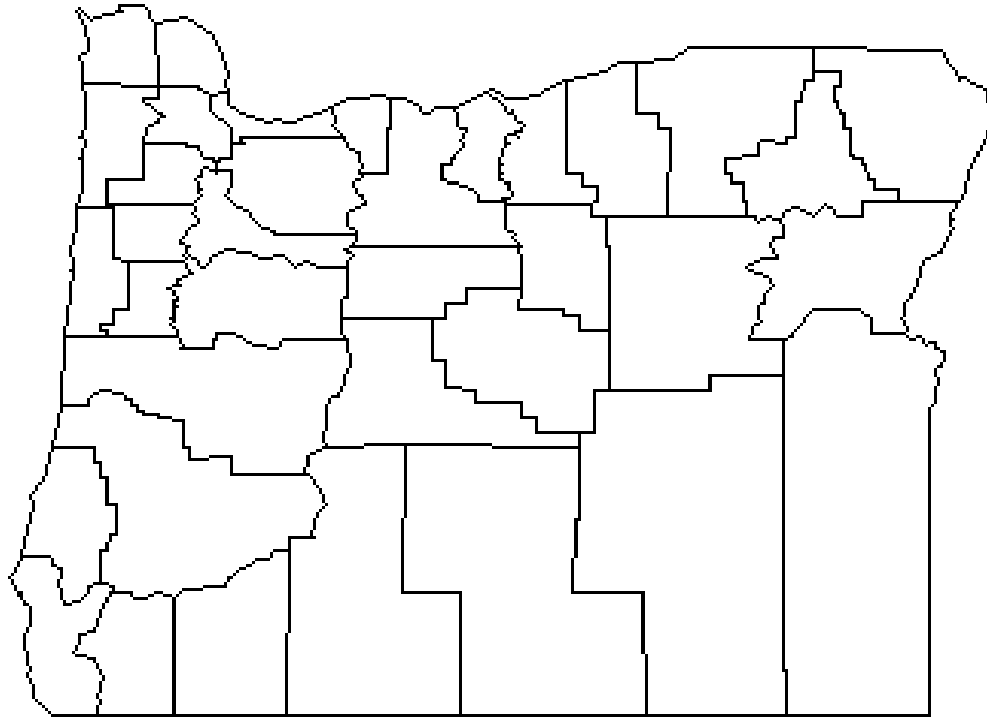

County Benchmark Data User,

This 2007 county data report has changed dramatically since the last county publication in 2005. Much of the *County Data Book* has been moved online and has seamlessly been incorporated into the Progress Board online benchmark reporting system. With this online system county data is updated as it becomes available, no longer presented only in a frozen biennial publication. Additionally, added online features such as benchmark maps and rural/urban charts are available to easily display county benchmark data. All of these features can be accessed and downloaded through the Progress Board's county data page: www.oregon.gov/DAS/OPB/CountyData.shtml.

Yet, as this document can attest to, a '*Snapshot*' in time is useful in bringing perspective to the ever-changing landscape of benchmark data. This document carries on the traditions of looking with broad brush strokes at how Oregon's Counties are fairing through the index ranks and county pages. These county pages include a ten-year snapshot of data from most of the 30 benchmarks with available county data; while also including three year averages for the county, their specific regional comparator (rural/urban*), and the state overall. Additionally, the county pages offer the 2005 statewide benchmark target, a brief trends summary, and the county benchmark rank.

With this report, a brief overview of each county's benchmark health is presented. This is not intended as a substitute to the rigorous exploration of data, but offers a starting point, or 'Snapshot' to the county benchmarks.

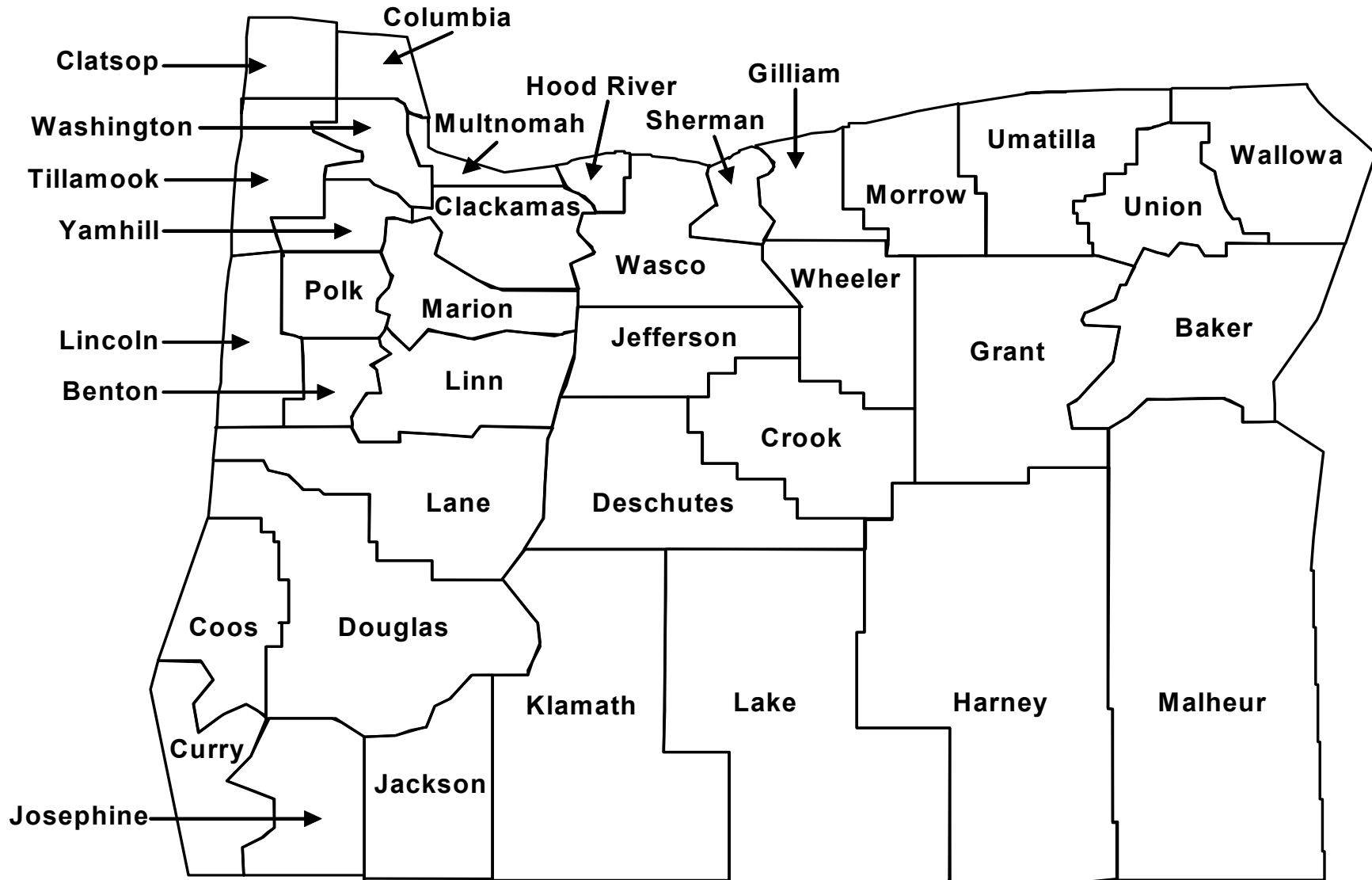

4. Net job growth (overall)

What it Measures: This measures change in average employment (including agriculture jobs from farms employing more than ten individuals) between the listed year and the year prior. **County Level Data:** The county data provides net job growth/loss per 1,000 population, whereas the statewide rates measures net growth. **About the target:** Target set by Oregon Progress Board. **Data Source:** Covered Employment and Payrolls, Oregon Employment Department.

5. Oregon's concentration in professional services relative to the U.S. concentration in professional services (U.S.=100%)

What it measures: The professional services industry includes investment advice, advertising agencies, engineering services, architectural services, accounting services, management consulting services, and legal services. This group traditionally provides services to the business community. The benchmark is a location quotient expressed as a percentage. It identifies Oregon's proportion of covered employment (covered by unemployment insurance) in professional services relative to the national proportion. A percentage of less than 100 percent indicates that we probably import services. The data used for this benchmark changed from eight two-digit to eight four-digit SIC codes. Beginning with 2001 data, NAICS codes replace SIC codes. **About the target:** Targets were set by the Oregon Progress Board. **Data Source:** Data are published covered employment estimates from the Oregon Employment Department and the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

11. Per capita personal income as a percent of the U.S. per capita income (U.S.=100%)

What it Measures: Per capita personal income is total personal income divided by the total population for the United States and Oregon. **County Level Data:** Urban and rural calculations differ from the metro and non-metro calculations measured by the Oregon Benchmark 11a & 11b. The calculations in this publication reflect percentages of U.S. population overall. By contrast, the Oregon Benchmark measures metro percent of metro U.S. and non-metro percent of non-metro U.S. **About the Target:** Target set by Oregon Progress Board. **Data Source:** Oregon Employment Department.

12. Average annual payroll per covered worker (all industries, 2006 dollars)

What it Measures: This measures total payroll for all industries divided by annual average employment in all industries, inflation adjusted. It is a gauge of the level of and change in incomes per worker. 2005 data onward includes newly-covered home health workers, therefore are not fully comparable with earlier years. **About the Target:** Target set by Oregon Progress Board. **Data Source:** Covered Employment and Payrolls, Oregon Employment Department. Figures are converted to 2006 dollars using the U.S. Implicit Price Deflator for Personal Consumption Expenditures.

15. Oregon unemployment: a. rate, b. percent of U.S. unemployment rate

What it Measures: Part a. Oregon's counties annual unemployment rate, which is the number of unemployed persons divided by the total number in the civilian labor force. Unemployed persons are those who do not have a job, have actively looked for work in the prior 4 weeks, and are currently available for work. All members of the civilian noninstitutional population are eligible for inclusion in the labor force, and those 16 and over who have a job or are actively looking for one are so classified. All others--those who have no job and are not looking for one, active military personnel and people in correctional or psychiatric institutions--are counted as "not in the civilian labor force." Part b. Part b is a measure of counties unemployment rate divided by the US unemployment rate. **About the Target:** Targets set by the Oregon Progress Board with consultation from the Oregon Employment Department. **Data Source:** Oregon Employment Department.

18. Percent of children entering school ready to learn

What it Measures: This benchmark uses data from kindergarten teachers completion of the Oregon Kindergarten Readiness Survey. Teachers assessed students' ability to meet six developmental dimensions gauged to determine young children's readiness for school. Data indicate the percentage of kindergartners meeting all six dimensions. **About the Target:** Target set by the Oregon Progress Board and the Oregon Department of Education. **Data Source:** Oregon Department of Education, Kindergarten Survey Report.

19. Percent of third graders who achieve established skill levels: a. reading, b. math

What it Measures: This benchmark measures the skills of Oregon students in reading and math as they proceed through school. They will be adjusted to reflect changes in assessment and definitions of educational attainment under the Oregon Education Act for the 21st Century, including Certificates of Initial and Advanced Mastery, as they are implemented. Data indicate the percentage of students meeting or exceeding established skill levels. The denominator for the percent of students meeting standards from 1996 – 2001 includes only students tested under standard conditions at or above grade level, while the denominator from 2002 forward includes all students, as required by the No Child Left Behind Act. 2005 results differ from the 2004 results in the following ways: a) test scores are aggregated to the school, district, and state level based on the student resident district as of May 2, 2005, whereas in 2004, test scores were aggregated based on resident district at the time the test was taken; b) regardless of where the student took the test, the highest score available is reported; and c) as per NCLB, beginning LEP (Limited English Proficient) students were not included in the results, whereas in 2004, beginning LEP students were included in the results. **About the Target:** Target set by Oregon Department of Education. **Data Source:** Oregon Department of Education, Oregon Statewide Assessment.

20. Percent of eighth graders who achieve basic established skill levels in third and eighth grades: a. reading b. math

What it Measures: This benchmark measures the skills of Oregon students in reading and math as they proceed through school. They will be adjusted to reflect changes in assessment and definitions of educational attainment under the Oregon Education Act for the 21st Century, including Certificates of Initial and Advanced Mastery, as they are implemented. Data indicate the percentage of students meeting or exceeding established skill levels. The denominator for the percent of students meeting standards from 1996 – 2001 includes only students tested under standard conditions at or above grade level, while the denominator from 2002 forward includes all students, as required by the No Child Left Behind Act. 2005 results differ from the 2004 results in the following ways: a) test scores are aggregated to the school, district, and state level based on the student resident district as of May 2, 2005, whereas in 2004, test scores were aggregated based on resident district at the time the test was taken; b) regardless of where the student took the test, the highest score available is reported; and c) as per NCLB, beginning LEP (Limited English Proficient) students were not included in the results, whereas in 2004, beginning LEP students were included in the results. **About the Target:** Target set by Oregon Department of Education. **Data Source:** Oregon Department of Education, Oregon Statewide Assessment.

22. High school drop out rate

What it Measures: In previous years, those high school students receiving a GED were counted as drop outs. In 1997, these students were excluded from dropout counts. This rate measures the percentage of students each year who leave the public K-12 school system from grades 9-12 before receiving a high school diploma or GED. This is calculated according to the procedures prescribed in ORS 339.505 to 339.520. Those who achieve high school equivalency certification in other ways are documented by another benchmark, which measures the completion rate in the population of all Oregonians at least 25 years old. **About the Targets:** Targets set by the Oregon Progress Board. **Data Source:** Oregon Department of Education, Early Leaver Fall Report.

23. High School Completion

What it Measures: The population of Oregonians at least 25 years old with a high school degree or equivalent, such as a GED. The high school completion, some college and baccalaureate measures are nested; each is a prerequisite for the next level of education. **County Level Data:** Unlike the state benchmark which gathers this data from the Oregon Population Survey, county data is gathered from the U.S. Census for years 1990 & 2000, and from the American Community Survey (ACS) from 2005 onward. Currently the ACS has data on counties larger than 50,000 by 2009 all counties over 20,000 will have data and by 2011 all of Oregon's counties will have yearly data on this measure. **About the Target:** Target set by Oregon Progress Board. **Data Source:** U.S. Census and the yearly American Communities Survey from 2005 onward.

26. Percent of Oregon adults (age 25 and older) who have completed: a. Bachelor's

What it Measures: The population of Oregonians at least 25 years old with a bachelor's degree. **County Level Data:** Unlike the state benchmark which gathers this data from the Oregon Population Survey, county data is gathered from the U.S. Census for years 1990 & 2000, and from the American

Community Survey (ACS) from 2005 onward. Currently the ACS has data on counties larger than 50,000 by 2009 all counties over 20,000 will have data and by 2011 all of Oregon's counties will have yearly data on this measure. **About the Target:** Target set by Oregon Progress Board. **Data Source:** U.S Census and the yearly American Communities Survey from 2005 onward.

31. Voting: a. percent turnout of voting age population.

What it Measures: The statewide benchmark measures voter turnout in presidential elections every four years as compared to the percent of voting age population, which may include some (such as felons) who are not eligible to vote. **County Level Data:** The county measure presented in this document deviates from the statewide measure by reporting on the percentage of registered voters participating in biennial general elections by county. Given this measure is registered voters, higher rates are expected than the statewide benchmark. **About the Target:** Targets set by the Oregon Progress Board. **Data Source:** Data are provided by the Oregon Secretary of State's Office, Elections Division.

39. Pregnancy rate per 1,000 females ages 15-17

What it Measures: The sum of resident live births and induced abortions among females ages 15-17 per 1,000 females ages 15-17. The rate does not include spontaneous abortions and fetal deaths. The pregnancy rate includes live births to Oregon residents and abortions for Oregon residents regardless of where the abortion was performed. Out-of-state abortions for Oregon residents may be under-reported because some states where Oregon residents go to have abortions do not report the patient's state of residence. **About the Target:** Targets are based upon a log trend reflecting the past decade of solid declines and best represents the tapering of rates we now see. **Data Sources:** Oregon Department of Human Services, Health Services Cluster, Center for Health Statistics, Oregon Vital Statistics Annual Report. Population Estimates for Oregon, published annually by the Center for Population Research and Census, School of Urban and Public Affairs, Portland State University.

40. Percent of babies whose mothers received prenatal care beginning in the first trimester

What it Measures: The number of resident live births to women who have prenatal care visits beginning in the first trimester divided by the total number of resident live births. **About the Target:** Set by the Department of Human Services, Health Services Cluster. Targets are set to reflect the importance of this issue. **Data Source:** Oregon Department of Human Services, Center for Health Statistics, Oregon Vital Statistics County Data Book. Population estimates used in the benchmark calculation come from the Population Research Center, School of Urban and Public Affairs, Portland State University.

41. Infant mortality rate per 1,000 live births

What it Measures: The number of infants (<365 days old) who die in a given year per 1,000 resident live births during the same calendar year. **About the Target:** Target set by Oregon Progress Board. **Data Source:** Oregon Department of Human Services, Health Services Cluster, Center for Health Statistics, Oregon Vital Statistics Annual Report. Population estimates used in the benchmark calculation come from the Population Research Center, School of Urban and Public Affairs, Portland State University.

42. Percent of two-year-olds who are adequately immunized

What it Measures: This statewide benchmark measures the percentage of two-year-olds who have received a set of immunizations known as the 4:3:1:3 series by age two. This series includes 4 doses Diphtheria/Tetanus/Acellular Pertussis, 3 Polio, 1 Measles/Mumps/Rubella, 3 Haemophilus Influenzae type b. **County Level Data:** The county measure presented in this document deviates from the statewide measure by reporting on the percentage of children ages 24 - 35 months who have received the the 4:3:1:3 series instead of through 24 months. This data comes from a statewide survey as opposed to the state benchmark data which comes from the CDC. State experts believe this revised population more accurately captures early immunizations than the federal statistics. **About the Target:** Set by Oregon Health Division, Healthy People 2000. **Data Source:** Oregon Department of Human Service, ALERT registry.

43. New HIV infection among Oregonians age 13 and older, by year of initial diagnosis: a. number

What it Measures: The number of persons diagnosed with HIV infection, including those with symptomatic and those with asymptomatic infection. Since July 2001, doctors, laboratories and other health care providers have been required to report all HIV cases in Oregon. Previously, estimates of HIV disease

in Oregon had been based on voluntary reporting and reports from confidential and anonymous HIV testing. Therefore, case data were less accurate because they were incomplete and some cases may have been counted more than once. Since 2002, case counts and incidence estimates have been based on actual HIV/AIDS cases reported as having been diagnosed during that year. For 2001 and all years prior, case counts were derived from HIV testing data, not actual reported cases. **About the Target:** Target set by Oregon Progress Board. **Data Source:** Oregon Department of Human Services, Health Services Cluster, Office of Disease Prevention and Epidemiology, Oregon HIV/AIDS Annual Report.

45. Premature Death: Years of life lost before age 70 (rate per 1,000)

What it Measures: Years of potential life lost (YPLL) quantifies premature mortality occurring in younger age groups by measuring the number of years between age at death and age 70. For example, a death at age 21 results in 49 years of "life lost." This composite figure first calculates the age-specific YPLL for each of seven age groupings 0-4, 5-14, 15-24, 25-34, 35-44, 45-54, 55-64, and 65-69 by taking the midpoint for each age group, subtracting from 70, and multiplying by the number of deaths in each age group. The resulting number for each age group is then divided by the age-specific population and standardized (weighted) to an age-homogeneous hypothetical population of 1,000 people per every 10-year age group. Standardizing permits valid comparisons over time. The weighted numbers are summed across ages, then divided by seven (seven 10-year age groups). **About the Target:** Target set by Oregon Progress Board. **Data Sources:** Oregon Department of Human Services, Health Services Cluster, Center for Health Statistics, Oregon Vital Statistics Annual Report. Population Estimates for Oregon, published annually by the Center for Population Research and Census, School of Urban and Public Affairs, Portland State University.

48. Number of child care slots available for every 100 children under age 13

What it Measures: This benchmark measures the availability of child care in Oregon. "Child care slots" represent the number of children which regulated and legally exempt child care providers in Oregon have the capacity to serve. **About the Target:** Target set by Oregon Progress Board. **Data Source:** Child Care Research Partnership and Oregon Employment Department, Child Care Division.

50. Percent of 8th grade students who report using:

- a. Alcohol in the previous month
- b. Illicit drugs in the previous month
- c. Cigarettes in the previous month

What it Measures: This measures the percent of eighth grade students who report they have used alcohol, illicit drugs or cigarettes in the past month.

County Level Data: Starting in 2006 county estimates are available biennially. 2006 results are from all respondents in all districts and schools within each county that participated in either the 2005 or 2006 Oregon Health Teens Survey. Annual state estimates and county level estimates prior to 2005 are from a random sample of districts and schools; therefore, the combined 2005/2006 county level tables may differ slightly than previous estimates. County statistics for 2004 and earlier are often combined at a regional or service delivery area (SDA) to increase estimates to an adequate statistical level. One such example is the combining of Sherman, Wheeler, and Gilliam counties in 2006 for measure 50a,b,c. Contact the Progress Board for a detailed explanation of these regional and SDA characteristics. **About the Targets:** 2010 target set using Aggressive-Negative method. **Data Source:** 1990-2000: This information is collected in the Oregon Public Schools Drug Use Survey, conducted in even numbered years for the Office of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Programs. 2001 and forward: Oregon Healthy Teens Survey, reported by the Oregon Office of Mental Health and Addiction Services and the Department of Human Services, Health Services Cluster, Center for Health Statistics. This voluntary statewide survey incorporates questions and design from both the federal YRBS and Oregon Public School Drug Use Surveys. Data after 2001 may not be directly comparable to earlier data due to changes in questionnaire and design. Please note the Illicit Drug Measure in 2004 did not include 30-day use of LSD or other Hallucinogens in the choices of illicit drugs so may not be directly comparable to the other year's statistics. 51. Number of child abuse or neglect victims per 1,000 Oregonians under 18 a. substantiated neglected abused b. threat of harm

What it Measures: The number of children who are substantiated as being abused and/or neglected, per 1000 children under 18 years old and at threat of harm for being abused and/or neglected per 1000 children under 18 years old. *County Level Data:* The county statistics combines parts a (substantiated) and b (threat of harm) in reporting child abuse levels in order to increase the size of the measures data set at the county level. Data ranges for some county statistics are given to protect the confidentiality of victims in counties with small population sizes. In 2004 data for Wasco and Sherman Counties are combined along with data for Wheeler and Gilliam Counties in order to assure adequate statistical representation. *About the Targets:* Target set by Oregon Progress Board. *Data Source:* Oregon Department of Human Services, CAF Program Performance and Reporting Research Unit. Note: To bring Oregon into alignment with how child abuse data are reported by most other states and the federal government, DHS now reports data captured within the federal fiscal year, Oct. 1, 2002 to Sept. 30, 2003, rather than the calendar year, as it had done in the past (before 2004).

53. Percent of pregnant women who abstain from using: a. alcohol b. tobacco

What it Measures: The number of pregnant women who report that they do not use alcohol or tobacco during pregnancy divided by the total number of respondents. *County Level Data:* This publication reports the inverse of the statewide measure with: the number of pregnant women who report using a. alcohol, or b. tobacco. *About the Targets:* Targets set by the Oregon Progress Board. *Data Source:* Oregon Department of Human Services, Health Services Cluster, Center for Health Statistics, Oregon Vital Statistics Annual Report. Population estimates used in the benchmark calculation come from the Population Research Center, School of Urban and Public Affairs, Portland State University.

53. Percent of Oregonians with incomes below 100% of the Federal poverty level. (overall)

What it Measures: This is a measure of the percentage of the population that is below the Federal poverty level. The U.S. Census Bureau determines poverty status of all people except those in institutions, military group quarters, college dormitories, and unrelated individuals under 15 years old. These groups were excluded from the numerator and denominator when calculating poverty rates. They are considered neither "poor" nor "non-poor." *County Level Data:* The county statistics use a different data source since the Current Population Survey doesn't allow for estimates at the county level to be created. *About the Target:* Target set by Oregon Progress Board. *Data Source:* Current Population Survey (from U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics and U.S. Census Bureau) estimates for statewide poverty rates. For yearly county statistics the US Census Bureau, Small Area Income & Poverty Estimate (SAIPE) is used, excluding 1999 when decennial census statistics are used. 59. Percent of seniors living independently outside of nursing facilities.

What it Measures: This measure estimates the percentage of Oregonians ages 75 (state level, 65 county-level) and older that are living independently outside of nursing facilities on any given day. Seniors in any community-based facility are considered to be living independently. *County Level Data:* As mentioned previously the county level data measures those 65 and over. This data source difference reflects methodological difficulties with data on those 75 and over. *Target:* Target set by Oregon Progress Board. *Data Source:* Oregon Department of Human Services, Senior and Disabled Services Division.

62. Overall reported crime per 1,000 Oregonians: a. person crimes b. property crimes c. behavior crimes

What it Measures: This is a measure of overall reported crimes (offenses) reported to law enforcement agencies in Oregon during a calendar year per 1,000 Oregon population. This includes the subcategories of (a) person crimes, (b) property crimes, and (c) behavior crimes. *About the Target:* Target set by Oregon Progress Board. *Data Source:* Oregon Department of State Police, Uniform Crime Reporting Program. Population estimates are provided either by official census or estimates by Portland State University, Population Research Center. 63. Juvenile arrests per 1,000 juvenile Oregonians per year: a. person crimes b. property crimes

What it Measures: These are measures of juvenile criminal arrests reported by law enforcement agencies in Oregon during a calendar year per 1,000 Oregon juvenile population. Reported offenses by juveniles are not possible since victims rarely know the age of the perpetrator. Juveniles are considered to be any individual less than eighteen years old at the time of the arrest. Any court data used in conjunction with this measure will reflect a somewhat different

pattern since age at the time of the commission of the offense is the determining factor for placement in the juvenile category. State variations in juvenile arrest rates may reflect differences in juvenile law-abiding behavior, police behavior and/or community standards. **About the Target:** Target set by Oregon Progress Board. **Data Source:** Oregon Department of State Police, Uniform Crime Reporting Program. Population estimates are provided either by official census or estimates by Portland State University, Population Research Center. 73. Percent of households that are owner occupied

What it Measures: This measures the percentage of Oregonians that report owning their own home, either with a mortgage or free and clear. **County Level Data:** Unlike the state benchmark which gathers this data from the Oregon Population Survey, county data is gathered from the U.S. Census for years 1990 & 2000, and from the American Community Survey (ACS) from 2005 onward. Currently the ACS has data on counties larger than 50,000 by 2009 all counties over 20,000 will have data and by 2011 all of Oregon's counties will have yearly data on this measure. **About the Target:** Target set by Oregon Progress Board. **Data Source:** The Oregon Population Survey, a random sample telephone survey of Oregon households conducted in even numbered years provides statewide statistics.

74. Percent of Oregon households below median income spending more than 30% of their income on housing (including utilities): a. renters b. owners.

What it Measures: A cost burdened household is any that meets the benchmark criteria. A housing affordability rule of thumb says the proportion of a household's income spent on rent or mortgage payments and other housing expenses should be less than 30 percent. **About the Target:** Target set by Oregon Progress Board. **Data Source:** Oregon Housing and Community Services Department. The 1990 and 2000 data points are from the U.S. Census Bureau reports. Data for non-census years is collected through the Oregon Population Survey, but only available at the statewide level.

83. Pounds of municipal solid waste landfilled or incinerated per capita

What it Measures: This benchmark measures the extent to which Oregon reduces municipal solid waste disposed, through recycling, composting, waste prevention, or other means. Data is collected by "wastesheds," which are generally the same as counties except: a) Clackamas, Multnomah, and Washington counties make up the Metro wasteshed; b) The Milton-Freewater and Umatilla wastesheds combine to make Umatilla County; and c) when the boundaries of small cities cross county lines, the entire city is placed in the wasteshed for the county that has more of the city's popus its data for Marion and Polk counties. **About the Target:** Target set by Oregon Progress Board. **Data Source:** Oregon Department of Environmental Quality, Land Quality Division.
